Boko Haram Continues to do Harm

Jama'atu Ahlis Sunna Lidda'awat which means "People Committed to the Propagation of the Prophet's Teachings and Jihad" was founded in 2002, by Mohammad Yusuf. The group was nicknamed Boko Haram, which loosely is translated into: Boko meaning "Western education" and Haram denoting "forbidden." The group was originally intended to increase intensity for Muslims, making sure they live according to Allah. In 2009, their leader was killed and they became more of a terrorist organization.

Voice of America reports Boko Haram attacks in Nigeria have killed 5,000 people and kidnapped hundreds, mostly young girls. Their goal is reportedly to kill all non-Muslims and create their own country. They have taken over the town of Baga, firing assault weapons into the people and killing children, women and the elderly because they could not run away. They now are claiming control of

It has been a very deadly week in Nigeria's history. A state of emergency has been declared but the government has done little to respond, because the current president is running for re-election.

"It's an enormously horrendous slaughter of innocent people, and Boko Haram continues to present a serious threat not just to Nigeria and the region but to all of our values and to all of our sense of responsibility regarding terrorism," said United States Secretary of State John Kerry.


5 'Frozen' Favorites


3 Must-Watch Winter

"There are a lot of good winter-themed movies, but one that comes to my mind particularly is *Groundhog Day,* starring Bill Murray," Williams said.

"It's an excellent movie that has a very creative and unique structure. It follows a news team reporting on Groundhog Day for a local news station, but when they get stranded because of a huge snowstorm in a rural Pennsylvania town, Phil (played by Bill Murray) becomes stuck in a time loop and relives the same day over and over again."

Williams says *Groundhog Day* is a good movie to watch during winter that is not Christmas or holiday related. This movie came out in 1993, but Williams says ther are some more recent releases he'd suggest.

"I would say *The Grand Budapest Hotel*, because it is a beautiful looking movie thats stylized and cartoonish-looking initially, but is full of interesting and well-developed characters. It came out in early 2014, and it is based on some short stories by the Austrian writer, Stefan Zweig," said Williams.

"It's set in a made-up snowy European country, which makes it a perfect movie to enjoy while you're cozy and warm inside during a cold winter's day. Be warned that there are a few scary scenes that might be too frightening for some viewers."



But if you're sick of winter and need to watch a movie to remind yourself that the warmer seasons are on the way. Williams has a movie for that too.

"I would pick a movie that came out in 2012 titled *Mud*. While it is not necessarily a movie about the summer, it's a coming-of-age story that takes place in the hot south, with lots of river scenes and outdoor imagery. It's heavily inspired by the works of Mark Twain (like the Adventures of Huckleberry Finn) and is about two boys who help a mysterious drifter (played by Matthew McConaughey) reunite his long lost love (Reese Witherspoon)," advised Williams.



All three of the movies Williams picked are interconnected. The actor Michael Shannon got his start in *Groundhog Day,* and also had a role in *Mud.* And, Bill Murray (the star of *Groundhog Day)* has a small role in *The Grand Budapest Hotel.*

"No matter the weather or season, enjoying a movie is always a good idea," Williams said.###
